

## TEACHER CHECKLIST PRIOR TO A SAT REFERRAL

- For academic concerns, compare the student's classroom performance to the Universal Screening Data.
  - a. If the student is struggling in class and Universal Screenings show he or she is in the bottom 25<sup>th</sup> Percentile, select a research-based intervention to implement with the student. These classroom interventions should be attempted before referring to SAT. Documenting the dates of the intervention will be helpful.
    - i. To select an appropriate research based intervention, refer to the RtI Interventions Manual or consult with the School Psychologist.
    - ii. For behavioral concerns, talk to the School Psychologist and/or School Counselor for an individual consultation.
    - iii. For speech concerns, talk to the Speech and Language Pathologist for an individual consultation.
- Notify parents of the problem.
  - a. Document the date they were notified on the Parent Contact Form.
- Gather at least one week of baseline data and then implement the teacher intervention.
  - a. For academic concerns, Universal Screening data can be used as a baseline.
  - b. If you do not know how to document baseline data, consult the School Psychologist or SAT Coordinator.
- Document the intervention on the Intervention Implemented Form.
- After at least 4 weeks, if the documented intervention has proven unsuccessful, fill out the Request for Student Assistance Form.
- Notify parents that the intervention was unsuccessful and inform them that you are going to complete a Request for Student Assistance.
  - a. On the Parent Contact Form, document that you notified them.
- Give parents the SAT brochure and Parent Input Form, and ask them to return the Input Form to the office.
  - a. On the Parent Contact Form, document that you gave them the information.
- Once you receive the Parent SAT Meeting Invitation in your mailbox, send it home to the parents.
  - a. On the Parent Contact Form, document that you gave them the form.
- Attend the SAT meeting with your data on the student.
